8. Reasons for proposing the new area of specialization:

The Masters of Education in Education with a specialization in Higher Education is a practitioner degree designed for students seeking entry-level professional positions at institutions of higher education. These positions are generally not research-oriented faculty positions, but rather teaching-oriented positions at community colleges or administrative positions. This proposed change makes the M.Ed. in Education (Higher Education) curriculum consistent with other professional programs in the School of Education.

9. Requirements for the area of specialization:

30-credits to include 9 of core content, 6 in research and evaluation, 3 credits each focused on students and teaching, 6 credits of electives, and a 3 credit capstone course. See attached Course Requirements listing.

Over the past four fiscal years, the number of students with this major and degree has been approximately 45-50 students per year. We anticipate that approximately 20 students will graduate with the higher education specialization each year.
