Announcements and Remarks

- Graduate Council Chair, Steven Lonergan
 - Lonergan warned the council that there were many items that might be voted on next month both from the council agenda and the GCCC agenda. He requested that members make sure to pre-read information before next meeting.
- Graduate Dean, William Graves
 - Graves had no remarks to begin the meeting
- Assistant Graduate Dean, Craig Ogilvie
 - Ogilvie had three notes: admission applications Jan 1 2017 to Jan 1 2018 are down about 17%, with 24% down for international students, 14% down for lowa residents, and 8% up for non-lowa domestic students. Graves suggested that the decline in applications could be due in part to the fact that some programs implemented pre-applications for the first time, and pre-application numbers within programs are not counted in Ogilvie's numbers. Miller suggested that the inverse relationship with current market conditions could also account for the decline, while Ogilvie pointed out that market conditions can also increase applications because successful companies pay for their employees to go to school.
 - Ogilvie noted that he checked in with approximately 60 African students on campus in light of recent national discourse.
 - Ogilvie also brought up whether the supervisors of Post Docs need to be members of the Graduate Faculty. There was some discussion about whether the requirement that supervisors must be faculty is enforced and whether people need to be faculty members to be members of the graduate faculty. It was confirmed that faculty must have affiliate status before they can become graduate faculty. Lonergan and Ogilvie will clarify whether

this policy needs to be better enforced based on current Handbook language or whether a change should be discussed in a later meeting.

Graduate College Office, Judy Strand – No report

Old Business

• Chapter 9 revisions –

Sub-Committee met to write a revised Chp. 9 that is informed by Dr. Graves's version of Chp. 9 and University Counsel's input but that retains the rights and responsibilities that were included in the April 2016 version that was approved by Graduate Council. New Business

Committees

- Outside Committee Member Committee: Report. Isaac Gottesman, Chr., Annette O'Connor, Nicola Bowler, Tonglu Li, Allen Miller, Dan Russell, Raimund Nagel, Mark Kaiser, Judy Strand, Sebastian Speer
 - O Gottesman gave a brief summary of the recent meeting of this committee, and after much discussion in the committee, they realized that they did not have enough information about how the outside member is actually handled across campus to make an informed policy decision. Gottesman presented a proposal to survey the DOGEs about outside members and other processes in their programs. There was discussion about the usefulness of the information the timeline for gathering answers, how much work it will take to evaluate the data, and the format in which the survey will be delivered to DOGEs (i.e. qualtrics survey).. Council suggested adjusting the letter to the DOGEs to be more general and less focused on just the outside member and adding a question about what problems the DOGEs see in their programs to the end of survey. Graves discussed the feedback, both negative and positive, from departments about the Graduate College assigning the outside member. Lonergan suggested that some tweaks be made to the letter and survey and it be reviewed either by e-mail prior to the February meeting or at the February meeting.
- Double Degree Committee: Submit Proposal for February vote: Double Degree Policy. Carleton Basmajian, Chr. (non-GC), Matt O-Neal, George Weston, Travis Sapp (non-GC), Natalie Robinson, Judy Strand.
 - Lonergan gave an overview of this change again, and questions were taken. Robinson raised a question about whether the policy should address double degree programs that mix thesis programs with non-thesis or coursework only programs. Speer clarified that historically, these programs were only approved as thesis with thesis or non-thesis with non-thesis. He confirmed that coursework only programs were not allowed because the Handbook states that double degree students must complete a single final oral exam and a single thesis or creative component that integrate both majors.
- Admission Status Committee (Full/Restricted/Provisional): Deb Marquart, Ken Moore, Gary Munkvold. Submit Proposal for February vote.
 - This was tabled until February.
- GFMC Committee: Pamela Riney-Kehrberg. Update on Associate Graduate Faculty approval process.
 - Riney-Kehrberg asked that DOGEs be reminded that approval of graduate faculty status is not a quick process (it takes approximately two months to approve a request) and that a vote of a majority of the members of a program is required for new graduate faculty appointments. She also noted that the number of associate members allowed on a POSC committee should be addressed by the Graduate Council at some point.
