

Matrix for Graduate Handbook - to be required for all ISU Graduate Programs – DRAFT

12/3/18 - The Graduate Handbook Requirement Committee of the Graduate Council met and voted to recommend that every ISU Graduate Program be required to provide a Graduate Handbook that includes (at a minimum) the “required” items in the Graduate Handbook Matrix outlined below.

We propose to provide a matrix/worksheet like the one below and require that programs define expectations and share them with students and faculty in a **Graduate Handbook** document, which also would be submitted to the Graduate College and posted here: <https://www.grad-college.iastate.edu/program-handbook/>.

Requirements listed could not be *less* stringent than those in the Graduate College Handbook, but they could be more stringent. A few examples of how the 2nd and 3rd columns would be completed are provided below. We think this would be a great way to help programs think through issues and “Best Practices” that should be defined and communicated within each PhD program.

- We plan to re-organize this matrix and list items in the order of deadlines posted on the Graduate College website.
- We intend to provide both REQUIRED and RECOMMENDED items; at present, most items in the matrix are REQUIRED.
- We also intend to provide more examples of how items have been defined by programs that already have Graduate Handbooks.

Date to complete POSC form	e.g., End of second semester	End of second semester (mandate is the semester prior to Prelim Exam)
Composition of POSC	e.g., Same as mandated by Grad College	Follow Handbook rules for Graduate Faculty membership. (mandate) One committee member must be outside the program (if interdepartmental) or department (if a department major)
Role of Outside committee member		Provide outside perspective and- if necessary – serve as intermediary to Graduate College regarding process, examination, and assessment issues. Perhaps this would require change in 6.4.2 in the handbook. Important to consider cases in which a dept has multiple majors and not all faculty are Graduate Faculty for all majors; the Dept decides how to handle this (not the Graduate College) Important to define different roles of and requirements regarding outside committee member for PhD vs MS vs non-thesis degrees
Required core of classes		Have a core, but be flexible. Should be up to POSC to adjust based on student project, experience, etc.
Completion of Preliminary exams (qualifying exams)		Depends on direct admits, starting as PhD with or without MS, etc. Generally the best practice is as early as possible.
Completion of Final Exams		As mandated by Graduate College calendars. Should not be more stringent.
Rules for examinations (public, private, etc)		Reporting is mandated by Graduate College Attendance rules are mandated by the Graduate College Are there times when a disability could require more flexibility?
Edits to POSC		Can be made in last semester, but generally should not ADD expectations in the last semester.
Expired courses		Carefully mandated in Handbook; program rules could be more strict.
Annual review of graduate student progress	e.g., Same as mandated by Grad College	Mandated by Graduate College.
What should the PhD dissertation, MS thesis or creative component include? What is process for approval?		

Qualifying Exams	e.g., see BBMB Grad Handbook	Not all graduate programs have Qualifying Exams; those that do should describe the requirements and associated deadlines

Assistantship Policies		Graduate College is considering a proposal to have only term appointments (i.e., 4.5 months regardless of when students start)

List of milestones for each year of the graduate program	e.g., see Psychology Graduate Handbook	Not mandated by Graduate College
Guidance for 1 st year students	e.g., list of URLs for where to find specific information both on and off campus
