Matrix for Graduate Handbook - to be required for all ISU Graduate Programs - DRAFT

12/3/18 - The Graduate Handbook Requirement Committee of the Graduate Council met and voted to recommend that every ISU Graduate Program be required to provide a Graduate Handbook that includes (at a minimum) the "required" items in the Graduate Handbook Matrix outlined below.

We propose to provide a matrix/worksheet like the one below and require that programs define expectations and share them with students and faculty in a **Graduate Handbook** document, which also would be submitted to the Graduate College and posted here: https://www.grad-college.iastate.edu/program-handbook/.

Requirements listed could not be *less* stringent than those in the Graduate College Handbook, but they could be more stringent. A few examples of how the 2nd and 3rd columns would be completed are provided below. We think this would be a great way to help programs think through issues and "Best Practices" that should be defined and communicated within each PhD program.
