4:45	 New Business <u>Distance Tuition memo</u> The greatest concern is distance-only graduate programs' ability to continue if students do not receive resident tuition, or at least something less than out-of-state tuition. Gray expressed the Council's desire to be on record in support of an amicable solution and to emphasize the urgency of a decision from the BOR. Hirschman suggested including student statements about the impact of changing tuition on distance student and offered to work with ELO to gather testimonials. 	enough. She suggested speaking to Shawn Boyne and/or Ann
	Marie VanderZanden to get the latest information regarding a
	policy, as there may be more information than has been
	communicated.
0	Lonergan emphasized that not having this most recent
	information is part of the problem, so he still feels that the memo
	is appropriate to send given the information that Council has
	today.
0	Lonergan, Gray, Nelson, and Robinson will review the memo and
	discuss whether it will be sent to the Provost's Office.
One co	ourse required after admission to certificate program
0	Robinson outlined the history of the policy that requires
	certificate students to take at least three credits after admission
	to the certificate program being born out of Dean Holger's
	insistence that students pursue certificates intentionally.
0	Brown discussed the Education for Social Justice certificate. While
	it is technically housed in the education department, the
	certificate is aligned more with elective courses and is taken by
	students outside of education as much as those within the major.
	Students have to make a choice to take these electives even if they forget to declare the certificate prior to their last semester
	at ISU. This is common among master's students, as they are here for such a short time.
0	Gray asked if the rule could be changed from requiring three
0	credits after admission to requiring that students cannot receive a
	certificate after graduation if the real concern is issuing a
	certificate retroactively.
0	Graves confirmed Dean Holger's desire for certificates to be
	earned intentionally to ensure that students receive advising and
	plan their certificate programs of study.
0	In Cutrona's 2.5 years in the Graduate College, she's seen
	students who couldn't make it through a master's program due to
	various life circumstances, and she's helped those students leave
	with a certificate so that they do not leave ISU with no credential
	to show for all of their hard work.
0	Haddad is the Director of Certificate Studies (DOCS) for the
	Geographic Information Systems (GIS), and she tells all College of
	Design students about the certificate upon admission and
	wondered if DOCS could make concerted efforts to communicate
	about these certificate programs at the time of admission.
0	Brown runs the applied research certificate in education, and
	many of these courses are embedded in the curriculum for
	education majors. He is aware that this is not always the case for
	certificates like ESJ, so it might be harder to communicate about
	the need to declare a certificate early to students in these types
	of certificate programs.
0	Graves mentioned that programs can always set stricter
	requirements for certificates than the Graduate College
	stipulates.
0	Robinson, Haddad, Brown, Ryan, and Johnson volunteered to take
	a look at the certificate section of the Graduate College Handbook
	to discuss needed revisions.

5.20	 Recruitment workgroup (Monica Haddad, Michael Bailey, Bethany Gray) Gray reported that English has seen a 30% increase in applications, while Adams reported a slight decline in EEB. Brown asked if the April 15 resolution is still in effect, as he'd heard rumors that CGS was not upholding it this year and that students felt pressured to commit to a school earlier. Graves offered to look into this and report back to Council via Robinson.
